# Memorial Day Trivia

Memorial Day is celebrated the last Monday in May. This was not always the case, however. The holiday used to have a fixed date of May 30, regardless of which day the holiday fell on. There is still much debate over this.

It was first celebrated to honor Civil War casualties. In the North, this day came about to honor fallen Union soldiers. The first decree said it was to respect the men who had defended the Union in the matter of the latest rebellion. Southerners, as a whole, refused to celebrate the day, as they were still hostile toward the North. They created their own holiday called the Confederate Memorial Day. It remains a state holiday in many southern states.

**Waterloo, New York is credited with having the first Memorial Day.** The first official Memorial Day was held on May 5, 1866. It took on a nationwide stance. Other locations across the country dispute this. Southerners say they began the first Memorial Day as they decorated the graves of fallen Confederate soldiers, and the idea was stolen by the Northerners.

The Indy 500 is a Memorial Day tradition. Since 1911, the Indianapolis 500 has been held in conjunction with national Memorial Day festivities.

An American tradition is visiting the gravesites and honoring the dead. Graves of soldiers from all wars are decorated with flags and flowers. The holiday was expanded after World War I to include American soldiers of any U.S. war or military action.

**Memorial Day was originally called Decoration Day.** The main events of this day each year were to honor the dead. Although the name did change in the late 1880s, it was still called Decoration Day until after World War II.

**There is a National Memorial Day concert.** It is held on the West Lawn of the United States Capitol building. Music is played and respect is paid to the men and women who gave their lives in service to the United States.

Memorial Day has an official USA recognition time. Memorial Day is officially observed at 3:00 p.m., Eastern Standard Time.

There is an American tradition on how to fly the American Flag. Flags should be lowered to half-staff from dawn until noon on Memorial Day.

**Many communities hold official Memorial Day parades.** Veterans and service organizations such as the Rotary, the Boy Scouts and the Girl Scouts usually participate in these hometown parades.

We Americans should stop for a while and remember those men and women who gave their very lives in sacrifice for our country.
